The e-Learning and Information Management (eLIM) Service is an Education Technology team that is part of Somerset's Support Services for Education. They support schools to develop innovative, engaging, effective and safe use of technology. They have recently completed a large scale project in Somerset, interviewing children with a focus on their wellbeing whilst online.

You will no doubt be aware that we engage fully with the subject of online safety at Wookey School, but so much of the input comes from our staff, so it is refreshing to hear from the children themselves.
