As well as this, they need all toiletries (new please) such as shampoo, shower gel, toothbrushes and toothpaste, nappies and wipes. Please ensure that all donations sent to school are sorted and clearly labelled as this needs to be done before we drop them off and we do not have the capacity to do that in school.

I am delighted to be able to take the children to St Matthew's Church again, rather than hold a 'virtual' service, but we have made the decision to only have children and not parents take part this year. Jan Shellard-Jones will be leading the service, and the children will be asked to bring tinned food to donate to the local food bank.
